Jones & Harris Represent UGF On All-Frontier Teams

Whitefish, MT – Sophomore basketball players **L.J. Jones (Anaheim, CA)** and **Kevin Harris (Houston, TX)** were honored today as they were selected to the 2009-2010 All-Frontier Conference Second Team as announced by conference commissioner Kent Paulson. The All-Conference Team is determined by a vote from the league's eight head coaches.

"I'm certainly proud of L.J. and Kevin for their accomplishments on the court," said UGF head coach **Steve Silsby**. "L.J. is a dynamic talent. Just looking at physical abilities he is arguably the most talented player in our conference. Everything you saw out of him this season was just raw talent. Hopefully he'll continue to improve with more and more reps in practice next season. Kevin is a kid that I give a lot of credit to. He comes from a tough neighborhood and he's really embraced life here at UGF. You never have to question his work ethic."

Jones, a 6'6" forward made a huge difference for the Argos once he became academically eligible near the end of January, helping an Argo team which had struggled to score all year long by providing some much-needed points, especially points in the paint. Jones appeared in the final 10 conference games of the season, making six starts, while averaging team-bests with 13.6 points and 7.1 rebounds per outing. Jones factored prominently in the Argos' three conference wins this season, averaging 17.0 points and 9.7 rebounds per game in the team's wins over Montana Tech and Rocky Mountain College (twice). He also contributed three double-doubles in his limited action this season.

Harris, a 6'0" guard appeared in 12 of the team's 14 conference games this season, averaging 9.0 points, 3.3 rebounds and 2.2 assists per game. Harris made six starts amongst his appearances in conference play and tallied five double figure scoring games, topping out at 20 points vs. Lewis-Clark State on February 6 (season high was 23 points vs. Alberta on Dec. 20). The highlight of Harris' season came in a game when he scored just three points, as he scored on a driving lay-up attempt with 2.3 seconds left to provide the winning margin in the Argos' 74-73 win over Montana Tech on January 23.

The Argos finished their 2009-2010 season with a record of 7-22, 3-11 and ended up in eighth place in the final Frontier Conference standings. However, bright things may be on the horizon as the Argos will return five of their top six scorers and seven players who averaged double-figure minutes of playing time per game.
