- Teach 12 credits per semester (fall and spring) in the undergraduate program of Forensic Science, with opportunities to teach in the summer, and integrated learning courses. On-line teaching may be required.
 - Instruct courses, and laboratory activities, in several of the following areas: basic forensic sciences, fingerprints, bloodstain pattern analysis, trace and impression evidence, arson and explosives, forensic DNA analysis, forensic anthropology, and topics related to evidence documentation, crime scene processing, and recovery/reconstruction.

 - Serve on faculty governance and university committees.
 - Participate in program assessment and development.
 - Provide service to the program, university, profession, and community.
